

Spot On Media Contest and Campaign for Local Youth

The Kootenai Alliance for Children and Families (KACF) is excited to announce this year's Spot On Media Contest Winner, Kylie Worley, a freshman from Post Falls High School. Not only did Kylie win an iPad Mini 2, her winning substance abuse prevention concept has been professionally produced into a television commercial, radio commercial, and print and social media campaigns.

This year's campaign message is, "The Power is in Your Hands." The meaning behind the campaign is that you have the power to make choices that can impact the community and the world for better or worse. Your choices have a ripple effect. One good choice can influence and inspire others to follow and spread the good. One bad choice can do the same. Ultimately the power is in your hands to choose.

The Spot On Media Contest engages local youth in the creative process of developing a drug prevention campaign. The project not only involves youth in the creative process of taking an idea and turning it in to a campaign, it also gives them a positive activity to do with their friends.

Students were asked to create a 90 second video describing their concept for a youth substance abuse prevention message that they would like to share with the Kootenai County communities. Over 20 students from Kootenai County participated in this year's contest. As part of the Spot On Contest all students were invited to participate in the production day. Production day is a chance for the students to be a part of transforming their message into a media campaign which included producing a television commercial.

"The community really comes together for this project," said Jessica Godderz, Spot On Contest Coordinator. "The local businesses and media support the program by significantly discounting their services, the schools and youth organizations help promote the contest, and parents as well as the community as a whole come together to encourage the youth to participate in the program."

NORTH InterAgency Communication aka The Priscoll List

A Career of Giving

Bob Driscoll's recent retirement from the Idaho Department of Health & Welfare recently may have ended his official role with the state, but his legacy and passion for bringing agencies and organizations together to better serve North Idaho families lives on.

Why & how did the "Driscoll List" and the "Interagency" meetings start?

I was recruited to the Idaho Department of Health & Welfare in 1997 right after Welfare reform. People needed help with budgeting and job skills because they were not making livable money, only surviving. I asked around and tried to find other agencies who where helping people. I assumed that local social workers would have a long list of referral agencies, but they didn't have those resources. Then I heard about a little group of 4-6 people who met for lunch once a month. The leader of the group was moving out of the area, and I thought it was the perfect platform for what I wanted to do so I took it on.

The "Driscoll List" started as a roster of agencies that I sent out every month, but I had to quit when the list started to be used commercially. That is about when the email list and the Interagency meetings started. People would email me about needs in the community and what resources were available. I thought the Interagency meetings could be a good tool to share information and network about what different agencies were doing. They've been going ever since – 10 years now.


What did you hope to accomplish?

My goal was selfish. I wanted to know how the heck I could help all these people with these needs, and help them become contributing members of society. I wanted to unite the community to focus on helping people to become self-sufficient. There was a little pin that came out about that time: WOW, Work over Welfare.

When the Interagency meetings first started, we had a lot of different sectors represented. I never wanted a "formal group," but a place to network and an opportunity for agencies to explain their programs.

What do you hope for the future?

I want more agencies to be involved outside of healthcare to present what they are doing. There are some wonderful programs all over the region that would flourish if more people knew about them. It's always been the case that whenever I send an email out requesting help, something happens. I have never seen a service not responded to – specialized or general. We are in a transition time of trying to make it that people can connect with one another more readily. That's why we have the group, and that's all I have ever wanted. I'm not going to quit. I still want my community to service 100% of everyone who lives here, whether they're looking for a job or internship, or need housing. It's MY community, and I always ask myself what I can do to make the lives of people better. If people are flourishing, I flourish.

Post Falls American Legion Honors the Community with a Flag Mural

New York artist Scott LoBaido has a big heart for America and for painting big murals of the stars and stripes to honor veterans. He embarked upon the 2015 Fifty States Tour in February with the goal of painting a flag mural on American Legion or VFW posts in every state. Idaho's mural was painted on the Steven H. Nipp American Legion Post 143 in Post Falls in April. The 40' x 8' mural was completed in about 10 hours over two days. LoBaido's "canvas" began as sheets of treated plywood that were transformed into a beautiful 3-dimensional waving flag. The dedication ceremony was attended by community members and veterans of WWII, Korean War, Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan and as described by the artist was a celebration of freedom made possible by all who serve in the armed forces.

ACHIEVING A VISION 2030 COMMUNITY GOAL

The Education Information Center, a new community-wide, comprehensive educational resources website, is on track to launch later this spring with the addition of new Visionary Partners who have recently joined the project. In addition to Knudtsen Chevrolet and Waste Management of Idaho, The Lake City Development Corporation has become a Visionary Partner for the Pre-K – Career Education Information Center. The project has also received commitments from the University of Idaho, Lewis-Clark State College, North Idaho Higher Education, and Avista Utilities.

The North Idaho Family Group, Inc., a 501(c) (3) corporation focused on developing healthy families and lifelong learning, is launching the new Education Information Center website, which will include educational information and opportunities from pre-kindergarten through

Visionary Partners











You've probably heard of Uber, Tesla, and AirBNB, but do you know what they have in common? They all use a model of "sharing economy" or "peer economy." In other words, a system built around the sharing of human and physical resources such as cars, ideas, houses, and other goods. Most often these resources are shared directly between the owner and the consumer, versus a larger distribution system like a hotel chain.



Uber: Connects riders & drivers through a mobile app.



AirBNB: An online community marketplace that connects people looking to rent their homes with people who are looking for accommodations.



Tesla: Electric vehicle maker that opened its patent portfolio to anyone, including competitors, who wants to use the intellectual property for productive purposes.

Fun Fact: The Tesla "stalls" in the Golden Corral parking lot are called "Superchargers," and part of national electric vehicle charging station network.



Bitcoin: A form of digital currency, created and held electronically. No one controls it and transactions are made with no middle men – meaning, no banks!



TaskRabbit: An online and mobile marketplace that allows users to outsource small jobs and tasks to others in their neighborhood.

Fun Fact: A Phoenix, AZ man, trying to earn the name "Mr. Sharing Economy" at one point drove his Tesla as an Uber by day, and rented as a "Tesla Hotel" on AirBNB by night.







Children who do not continue to read over the summer can lose as much as three months of reading achievement.

WIC Nutrition Program Helping Thousands of Local Mothers and Children

You're a teacher, a doctor, a chauffeur, a coach, and a chef. You're a mom. You do a lot. WIC helps a little.

WIC (Women, Infants and Children) dietitians consult with parents and mothersto-be to ensure a healthy start for their growing babies. Clients are provided with WIC checks that can be used for various nutritious foods, including fruits, vegetables, meats, milk, cheese and eggs.

Participating moms are more likely to give birth to healthy babies, breastfeed and not use tobacco during pregnancy. Studies have shown that in-utero and early childhood health has positive long-term impacts on obesity and diabetes.

WIC is a federally-funded program, administered by Panhandle Health District (PHD). WIC is currently offered in each of the 5 northern Idaho counties, and starting in July 2015, PHD is opening its sixth WIC office in Post Falls.

"We serve thousands of families in our Hayden office and many of them live in Post Falls," said Kim Young, WIC Coordinator. "With the additional location, we hope to increase convenience for clients and reach out to more families who can benefit from WIC. Everyone deserves access to nutritious foods and support for providing for their family."

To qualify for WIC, you must be a woman who is pregnant, breastfeeding, or have children under age five. You must be income eligible, ranging from \$21,590 annual income for a family of one to \$74,167 annual income for a family of eight. For a full income chart, visit www.panhandlehealthdistrict.org. Families receiving Medicaid, SNAP benefits and TANF are automatically eligible.


