
Therefore, we must find a way to help our kids stay safe online and develop the needed skills to identify and avoid harmful situations.

# Annual "Must Do" List

It's not a New Years Resolution per se, but making the completion of this list an annual habit will set your year on the right track to help you avoid costly, frustrating, or time consuming misses.

## **Check your Credit Score:**

Most online sources give you one annual check for no charge. Do your homework first to understand what the score means, what action you need to take if you think there are mistakes, and how to keep track of the report. Review your monthly budget for the year as well.



## **Check your Insurance Coverages:**

It is important to review your policies periodically, especially with skyrocketing construction costs ... The reason behind this is to ensure that you continue to have adequate protection for the future and to safeguard your income earning abilities despite all the life changes you may go through.

## **Check for Expiration Dates:**

- Check your drivers license and make sure it doesn't expire within the year, and that all information is current. Take action early to make corrections and avoid unnecessary fines and fees.
- Check your vehicles license plate tags and insurance cards. Make sure they're current and that you know when they are due to renew.
- Check your credit/debit card(s) for expiration dates to assure any auto pay items associated with them are not interrupted. Also, assure any accounts that have automatic renewals (clubs, memberships, magazines, etc.) are ones you still use, and cancel those you don't want.
- Check payment apps (CashApp, Venmo, etc.) and digital payment cards for expirations, balances, etc.

## Send in your Absentee Ballot Request:

Vote from home, easily, and on time. A request for absentee ballots that cover all elections in the current year are available online. See sample here. Mail to the elections office and they will send your ballot in the mail prior to each election. Note: this must be redone every calendar year. Go to kcgov.us > elections > absentee ballot.

## Update your calendar with Registration Deadlines:

Summer camp registrations, schools, scholarships, sports teams, tournaments, and any other activities that have limited space and requirements to register in advance.

## Schedule your Annual Check Ups:

Make a check list of dates your entire family is due for appointments and schedule them at one time (when possible). Avoid missing a dental check up, mammogram, or childhood immunization appointments. A year can go by quickly!

## **Block out Special Events:**

Make note and plans for upcoming holidays, special birthdays, or graduations to avoid being caught unprepared when the occasion arrives.

"We were surprised, honored and humbled to be the group invited to represent the great state of Idaho for this event", said Stevens. "We had the experience of a lifetime making it through the application and audition process to perform in two previous Inauguration Parades live in Washington, D.C. This year's surprise invitation came without making application. We are thrilled to be able to contribute in this year's virtual parade with the special goal of highlighting the goodness and hope of Americans across our nation." "We could not do it without the support of our families and community", said Stevens. "We are especially thankful to the Hagadone Hospitality Co. facility, Backhand Productions filming, 1st Presbyterian Church rehearsal space, Kiki Miller public relations and organizational management, an army of praying grandmas, and the many other volunteers who made this possible on such short notice."

The members of this COVID year mini-team include medical and health professionals, educators, business managers, retirees, and a

scientist; all with loving hearts of a humanitarian nature.

Over their 25 year history, The Red Hot Mamas have appeared in hundreds of local and regional parades, The popular musical/comedy community service Red Hot Mamas performance company traveled a warp speed road to create their performance for the event.



# Important deadlines for 2021 High School Seniors

NOW is the time to apply for financial aid & scholarships for the 2021/2022 school year. Federal, State, and individual college deadlines vary widely. Most counselors recommend applying for federal financial aid with the FAFSA even if you think you won't qualify, or you think you won't need the aid.

- 2021/2022 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is available NOW (FAFSA.ed.gov – Make sure to use THIS site to apply).
- Early 2021: Deadline for CSS / Financial Aid PROFILE Application (found at CollegeBoard.org)
- March 1, 2021: Idaho Deadline for applying for an Opportunity Grant. (A Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) is a grant for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need.)
- February, March, & April are the main scholarship deadline months. Visit edinfocentercda.com/ Pay-for-School/ North-Idaho-Scholarships for local & regional scholarship opportunities.
- Contact your student's potential colleges to find out about school-specific scholarship opportunities and financial aid deadlines.

Don't wait! FAFSA changed in 2017 so that students now use "prior-prior" year tax information when reporting personal & family income. It is better to start the process than to wait and risk missing deadlines.



# The Story of Stone Soup

Once upon a time there was a great famine in which people jealously hoarded whatever food they could find, hiding it even from their friends and neighbors. One day a wandering traveler who hadn't eaten in days arrived in a village asking for a small meal.

"There's not a bite to eat in the whole province," he was told. "Better keep moving on."

"I have asked you for food and you have no food. Well, we will have to make stone soup!" he said. He asked for large iron pot, filled it with water, and built a fire under it. Then, with great ceremony, he pulled an ordinary smooth stone from his pocket and dropped it into the water.

By now, hearing the rumor of food, most of the villagers had come to the square or watched from their windows. As the traveler

Chicken Enchilada Soup

1 lb diced chicken breast 2 tbsp vegetable oil 1 cup heavy cream <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup diced yellow onion 1/2 cup diced green pepper 1/2 cup diced red pepper 1 bunch cilantro chopped 2 tbsp minced garlic 8 oz canned diced green chiles 16 oz green enchilada sauce 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese  $1\frac{1}{2}$  at chicken stock 8 oz cut tortilla 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tbsp chili powder 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tbsp cumin 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> oz onion powder 1 tsp black pepper

In large sauce pan heat vegetable oil, add chicken meat and brown. When chicken is fully cooked add peppers and onion mix and cook until translucent. Add garlic, chicken stock, heavy cream, chiles, enchilada sauce, chili powder, cumin, onion powder and black pepper. Bring to a boil then reduce heat to a simmer, allow to simmer 20 minutes. Add cilantro, tortillas and cheese stirring constantly to prevent from sticking. Cook until tortillas are fully dissolved. (Slightly thicken with corn starch slurry if desired) Rustic Italian Tortellini Soup

Chef Phil Biggerstaff, Hospice of North Idaho

3 Italian turkey sausage links (4 oz each),
casings removed
1 medium onion, chopped
6 garlic cloves, minced
2 cans (14½ oz each) reduced-sodium chicken broth
1¼ cups water
1 can (14½ oz) diced tomatoes, undrained
1 package (9 oz) refrigerated cheese tortellini
1 package (6 oz) fresh baby spinach, coarsely chopped
2¼ tsp minced fresh basil or ¾ tsp dried basil
¼ tsp pepper
Dash crushed red pepper flakes
Shredded Parmesan cheese, optional

Crumble sausage into a Dutch oven; add onion. Cook and stir over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in the broth, water and tomatoes. Bring to a boil. Add tortellini; return to a boil. Cook for 7-9 minutes or until tender, stirring occasionally. Reduce heat; add the spinach, basil, pepper and pepper flakes. Cook 2-3 minutes longer or until spinach is wilted. Serve with cheese if desired. Yield: 6 servings (2 quarts).

Soon a villager approached, holding carrots he'd retrieved from his cellar, and added it to the pot. "Capital!" cried the traveler. "You know, I once had stone soup with carrots and a bit of beef as well, and it was fit for a king."

The village butcher managed to find some beef... and so it went, through salt, pepper, potatoes,

onions, cabbage, mushrooms, and so on, until there was indeed a delicious meal for all. The villagers offered the traveler a great deal of money for the magic stone, but he refused to sell and traveled on the next day.

### Pumpkin Chili

2 cups black beans, cooked
½ medium sized pumpkin, cubed
1 tbsp grape seed oil
¼ onion
1 shallot
1 clove garlic
1 pint canned salsa
¼ cup sundried tomatoes
1 tbsp pumpkin pie spice
2 tbsp cocoa powder
1 tsp chili powder
1 tbsp cumin
1 tsp salt
water to cover, to desired consistency, roughly 2-4 cups

Soak, sprout and cook black beans ahead of time. Caramelize onion, shallot, and garlic in grape seed oil. Add remaining ingredients with enough water to cover all ingredients, to desired consistency. The longer you let it cook, the better!



# UNITED WAY OF NORTH IDAHO COVID CRISIS CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIP

One of United Way's impact goals is to ensure that all children have nurturing early experiences and enter school ready to learn. To do this, we build public-private partnerships to provide more affordable, high-quality child care for working families in our region. This matters to children and working families today, and for the future of our communities.

This scholarship fund was created through the City of Coeur d'Alene Community Development Block Grant, the Innovia Foundation, Idaho Community Foundation, Pita Pit, and United Way's Ride for ALICE fundraiser.

The UWNI Child Care Scholarship is a pool of funds created through grants and fundraising to support families who are attending school or employed and need assistance paying for care for pre-K and school-age children. You may qualify even if you also receive Idaho Child Care Assistance (ICCP). Scholarships are awarded as a monthly supplement paid directly to a licensed care provider. Families may receive up to \$1500 total over a period of 2-5 months, based on need and funds available.

Scholarships are available to families with children who meet the following criteria:


- Living in any of Idaho's five northern counties: Benewah, Bonner, Boundary, Kootenai, and Shoshone counties
- Pre-tax income at or below 80% Area Median Income:
- Employed and/or enrolled in school or a job training program (includes local community colleges, technical programs, high school completion, etc.)
- Paying for at least one child in a licensed early care and education program or out-of-school care program.


