

Annual "Must Do" List

It's not too late to complete this annual "to do" list to keep your year on the right track and help you avoid costly, frustrating, or time consuming misses.

Check your Credit Score:

Most online sources give you one annual check for no charge. Do your homework first to understand what the score means, what action you need to take if you think there are mistakes, and how to keep track of the report. Review your monthly budget for the year as well.

Check your Insurance Coverages:

It is important to review your policies periodically, especially with skyrocketing construction costs ... The reason behind this is to ensure that you continue to have adequate protection for the future and to safeguard your income earning abilities despite all the life changes you may go through.

Check for Expiration Dates:

- Check your drivers license and make sure it doesn't expire within the year, and that all information is current. Take action early to make corrections and avoid unnecessary fines and fees.
- Check your vehicles license plate tags and insurance cards. Make sure they're current and that you know when they are due to renew.
- Check your credit/debit card(s) for expiration dates to assure any auto pay items associated with them are not interrupted. Also, assure any accounts that have automatic renewals (clubs, memberships, magazines, etc.) are ones you still use, and cancel those you don't want.
- Check payment apps (CashApp, Venmo, etc.) and digital payment cards for expirations, balances, etc.

Send in your Absentee Ballot Request:

Vote from home, easily, and on time. A request for absentee ballots that cover all elections in the current year are available online. See sample here. Mail to the elections office and they will send your ballot in the mail prior to each election. Note: this must be redone every calendar year. Go to kcgov.us > elections > absentee ballot.

Update your calendar with Registration Deadlines:

Summer camp registrations, schools, scholarships, sports teams, tournaments, and any other activities that have limited space and requirements to register in advance.

Schedule your Annual Check Ups:

Make a check list of dates your entire family is due for appointments and schedule them at one time (when possible). Avoid missing a dental check up, mammogram, or childhood immunization appointments. A year can go by quickly!

Block out Special Events:

Make note and plans for upcoming holidays, special birthdays, or graduations to avoid being caught unprepared when the occasion arrives.

12 Ways to Create Effective Facebook Events

As a publisher/sharer of events and information from MANY local nonprofits, it's frustrating to try to share events with missing information! Sprout Social offers these tips:

- 1. Give your event a unique name
- 2. Write a clear & thorough description
- 3. Use Facebook's recognized venue locations
- 4. Use an eye-catching event photo
- 5. Use keywords for tags
- 6. Manage permissions for posting on your event
- 7. Set an end time
- 8. Promote your Facebook event with ads
- 9. Partner up with co-hosts
- 10. Promote your event outside of Facebook
- 11. Schedule events in advance
- 12. Create a sense of urgency

Another thing to consider are your FLYERS! How many times have you seen a shared event or image of a flyer with missing information?

You never know who might share your event, or where it might be shared from. ALWAYS include:

- DATE
- TIME
- NAME OF EVENT
- WHO IS IT FOR? (Especially if it's a fundraiser!)
- LOCATION
- CONTACT INFORMATION





Important deadlines for 2023 High School Seniors


NOW is the time to apply for financial aid & scholarships for the 2023/2024 school year. Federal, State, and individual college deadlines vary widely. Most counselors recommend applying for federal financial aid with the FAFSA even if you think you won't qualify, or you think you won't need the aid.

- 2023/2024 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is available NOW (FAFSA.ed.gov Make sure to use THIS site to apply).
- Early 2023: Deadline for CSS / Financial Aid PROFILE Application (found at CollegeBoard.org)
- March 1, 2023: Idaho Deadline for applying for an Opportunity Grant. (A Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) is a grant for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need.)
- February, March, & April are the main scholarship deadline months. Visit edinfocentercda.com/Pay-for-School/North-Idaho-Scholarships for local & regional scholarship opportunities.
- Contact your student's potential colleges to find out about school-specific scholarship opportunities and financial aid deadlines.

Recent Changes (2022) to Know About

- Simplified form now has 36, rather than 108 questions to answer
- Applications can select their role: parent, preparer, or student
- Drug convictions will no longer affect student eligibility to receive federal aid
- Male applications can receive financial aid even if they don't register for selective service



Kids Learn & Listen Differently!






We know all kids learn differently, but sometimes our rules do not reflect that knowledge.

A common classroom rule is "Whole Body
Listening" where children are instructed to sit,
look, and be still and quiet while listening and
learning. Some kids learn best this way, but this is
not true for all kids. Rules should not instruct
children to listen in only one way because it is
unique to each child!

A lifeline ... Heritage Health triage nurse makes the right call

Skip is not a fan of hospitals.

After having a triple bypass a few years back, he would rather never go back. However, Skip had a nagging cough and wasn't feeling right. His medical provider wanted him to go seek immediate care.



Skip wasn't budging from his Coeur d'Alene home.

Then Charlotte, a triage nurse for Heritage Health, spoke to him on the phone to see how he was doing. The conversation was a struggle. Skip was having trouble breathing and his condition was getting worse.

"I was dingy and incoherent," says Skip. "I didn't know what was going on."

Skip's story is common. Research indicates that 1 in 4 Americans refuse to go to the hospital when healthcare providers recommend that they go. People decline to go for a variety of reasons, but often it's fear of the unknown.

Skip's wife, Rose, was Christmas shopping with her daughter in Post Falls at the time of Skip's health crisis. She was alerted by Charlotte that her husband was refusing to go to the hospital.

"Charlotte insisted that Skip go to the hospital," says Rose. "I said I can be home in about an hour and Charlotte said, 'It will be too late. He needs to go now."

Charlotte contacted 911 and Skip was rushed to the hospital.

Skip, who is elderly, was diagnosed with respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), the flu and COVID-19. He spent three days in the hospital being treated for his breathing problems.

"I am not hospital orientated, but she kept saying 'Skip you should go.'," says Skip. "I have a lot of respect for Charlotte. She was outstanding. She took the bull by the horns and made the right calls. Thank God she did it."

Charlotte is one of six triage nurses for Heritage Health. Together they handle about 1,600 calls a month and help people determine their next steps for medical care.

"As a team, we probably saved his life," says Charlotte. "Our entire organization works together. In this case, a medical assistant called me with their concerns and I took it from there. But it wasn't just me, the dispatcher at 911, the EMTs and the hospital staff worked together as a team."

Taking calls from people who are having a health crisis can be stressful at times, but triage nurses are trained to remain calm and to follow safety protocols.

"It's a gift, not just for the people we help, but for us as well," says Charlotte. "We love to do this."

A month after his hospital stay, Skip says he feels "chipper" and like he can really do something physical in 2023.
