# **VARSITY FOOTBALL: Not Just for Boys**

arah Cook isn't afraid to be a girl that breaks into a new field. In this case, a football field. A junior at Coeur d'Alene High School, Sarah has recently received her Varsity Pin as a member of the CHS Football Team. Since her freshman year, she's been one of the managers of Viking Football and plans to continue in the field.

Cook has always liked to help. She's been an Ironman volunteer and involved in reading programs at the Skyway Elementary to name a few. Now her idea of volunteering includes standing on the sidelines under the Friday Night Lights.

"This job has duties that are much more than being the water girl," said Cook. "Players rely on the managers to keep the team going on more levels than just being well-hydrated." Duties include set up and take down of equipment before and after games and practices, keeping track of the school's property and sometimes restocking the concession stands. When the team travels to other schools to play, the managers travel on the players bus, unload trailers, stage equipment, and keep the team supplied.

Working on the sidelines, Cook sees the game from a much different perspective. The managers are intimately involved with the team's injuries, victories, and disappointments. It is one of the reasons Cook loves the job. "I have way more school spirit than many girls because I'm part of the team. The players respect me and appreciate all I do for them and it shows", said Cook. "I have gotten to know so many people that I

would have never had crossed paths with without football. It's been a great experience and a great part of my life."

One of Cook's favorite memories of being on the team was at the half-time game against Madison High School. The song "My House" by Flo-Rida came on in the locker room and all the boys starting singing and dancing to the song. "Now every time I hear that song, I think about that moment", she said.

"Being a manager is hard work but a valuable experience" she said.
"I can't believe that I've earned my varsity pin. I'm very proud of it, especially because I know it represents so much more than being a water girl".

As a manager, her time and dedication to the team is extensive. Two-a-day practices start in August and then daily after school, with a minimum of 15 hours per week spent with the team. Cook's mom Carrie, added, "We have to plan our family's camping trips around my daughter's football schedule ... that is sort of a strange thing to say".

Volunteering in the sports program at CHS has exposed her to possible college scholarship opportunities as well as related career fields. Cook is busy. She is also manager of the JV and Varsity Wrestling Team, along with garnering straight A's in the Physical Therapy Aid program at KTEC. She hopes to attend college to become a Physical Therapist and has considered managing football on the college level.


# Join a Library Summer Reading Program





# Connecting People, Place, Food and Farms

The Inland NW Food Network is a young organization in our region that connects people, place, food and farms through education and outreach. Founded in 2014 by Teri McKenzie, the volunteer-based group has organized numerous programs designed to give people the tools and resources needed to access, grow, and prepare healthy, delicious food, and to support local organic farmers.

Among the varied offerings the organization hosts, their newest – the Seasonal Kitchen – is a monthly cooking class where participants prepare dishes that

are seasonal and local (examples include root vegetables in February, fermented foods in late summer, venison/elk in the fall). Plans are also underway to expand the program by collaborating with area schools to form children's cooking clubs.

Other programs include a monthly book club, Chew on This, (an educational program with guest speakers who address a range of topics related to food and gardening/farming), workshops, farm-to-table dinners, and a "pop up" garden party. Their Local Investing Program is an innovative peer-to-peer, low interest investment model that strives to grow our region's food system by connecting lenders to borrowers (farmers, food entrepreneurs).

This summer the group will host a farm to table dinner at Castle Rock Ranch, a farm tour, and will have a booth at the Kootenai and Liberty Lake Farmers Markets.

# Be Smart Around Lead, Play Clean!

Lead and other metals are found in the soil along the Coeur d'Alene River, its South Fork, and the Chain Lakes.

- Wash hands and face before eating.
- Bring water for all personal use. Don't use filtered river water.
- Eat on a table or blanket in grassy areas.
- Limit children's hand-to-mouth contact.
- Remove dirt on clothes, toys, pets, and equipment before leaving.

# RECREATE SAFELY

- Recreate in designated areas and stay on trails.
- Wear dust covering over mouth and nose when riding offroad trails.
- Follow fish consumption advisories. It is best to eat fillets only.
- Do not harvest edible plants from floodplain areas.





# **Teenage Driver Soon?**

#### BEFORE THEY GET BEHIND THE WHEEL...


 Sit down with them before you sign them up for Driver's Ed and go over what is expected of them when they begin their training. Emphasize that driving is a privilege, not a right.



- If you are considering buying them a car, check with your insurance
  - agent. A common mistake is assuming an older car means less expensive insurance.
- Texting while driving is now the #1 cause of death in car accidents. Checking
  text takes an average of 5 seconds. At 35 MPH, it translates to driving the
  length of a football field blindfolded. Describe this to your teen and demand
  they put the phone away while driving.
- A 3.0 GPA or higher provides a discount on insurance.
- When they are in driver's training, take every opportunity to be in the car
  with with them. Do your best to not "over react" to minor errors they're
  learning. It is an opportunity to help build confidence and assure they
  thoroughly understand the rules of the road, operate a vehicle safely, and
  wear their seat belts.
- Consider signing a "young driver contract" with your teen. It is an excellent starting point for conversations surrounding their driving experience as well as a useful tool for assuring a safe and successful course for all.

- Dress the child lightly and control the room temperature. 70 degrees is ideal.
- Do breast feed and use pacifiers.

#### DON'T:

- Don't put a baby to sleep with blankets, pillows, stuffed animals, or bumper pads.
- Don't ever sleep with an infant.
- Don't put a baby to sleep on chairs, sofas, futons, beanbags, or cushions.
- Don't put babies to sleep on soft mattresses such as pillow-tops, waterbeds, or memory foam. If the baby leaves an impression in the mattress, it's too soft.
- Don't expose babies to secondhand smoke.



# WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WRITE A CHILDREN'S BOOK?

A. Five years ago, the company I was working for eliminated their entire sales force. Rather than feel sorry for myself, I made the most of an unfortunate situation. I decided to reevaluate my career. I made a list of my passions and things that were important to me. Some of the top items on the list were family, children, animals, and writing. That was my inspiration for Stewy Baby Finds a Home - a children's book, loosely based on my family's first dog, Stewy. Stewy Baby Finds a Home is a quirky chapter book written from Stewy's point of view. Each one of my books has a message for the kids.





#### WHAT'S THE MESSAGE IN THIS BOOK?

A. That's it's okay to be different. Embrace who you are.

# I UNDERSTAND YOU HAVE A NON-PROFIT PROGRAM AS WELL. WHAT CAME FIRST? THE NON-PROFIT OR THE BOOK?

A. The book. I was hoping to get into the schools and do readings. A friend suggested I start a reading incentive program. I took the idea and ran with it. Stories with Stewy, was launched in the fall of 2015 to over 40 classrooms. The first time I went to a classroom with the program I had that "ah ha" moment that everyone hopes for. I thought "This is what I'm supposed to do with my life." It was extremely rewarding to see the kids get so excited about reading and writing. I believe that if you have a passion for something, it can be contagious. The main reason I started the program was to share my love for reading and writing with the kids.

#### **HOW DOES STORIES WITH STEWY WORK?**

A. It's a reading incentive program sponsored by a local business or individual. I like to focus on second and third grade students. Basically, I attend each classroom and have an interactive reading of the first chapter of Stewy Baby Finds a Home. Then, I explain the program to the kids. Each student receives an autographed copy of my book and a reading log. If the kids read a certain amount of minutes they receive a Stories with Stewy/Sponsor backpack. The classroom also gets a stuffed Stewy Mascot dog that learns with them. At the end of the four week program, the child in the classroom with the most reading minutes takes Stewy home. We also have a contest between each classroom. The classroom in the school with the most combined reading minutes gets a special Stewy party with the real Stewy dog. This seems to be the biggest incentive for the students. They love Stewy, and Stewy, is absolutely head over heels in love with the kids.

# What is Elder Mediation and Why is it Important to My Family?

Those of us who share everyday life with a senior citizen like a parent or grandparent, have seen the subtle and sometimes dramatic changes in their lives. These folks may have seen their spouse, family, and best friends fight physical changes, illness and even pass away. They are concerned about their future and what the inevitable ongoing changes in life may mean to them.

Our elderly family members may think, "I've always been the leader of the family, now my children are telling me what to do."

In a study by Genworth Financial, more than half of all respondents (55%) reported that their greatest fear regarding a long-term care illness or event was being a burden on their family. In fact, they reported being five times more concerned about being a burden than dying.

However, more than 90% surveyed have not talked about critical long-term care issues with their spouse/partner, aging parents or adult children.

Elder Mediation is a process that facilitates respectful, meaningful discussion to assist families as they plan for these changes before they occur. In fact, one might even call it a 'family meeting'.

Typical issues discussed may include: The specific wishes of the elderly individual, the ability of the family to realistically fulfill those wishes, driving and transportation needs, health care options, housing, visitation, managing home repair, long-term care, financial options, etc.

Mediation is confidential and promotes respectful and constructive communication. A trained mediator guides the parties through a process, which promotes dialogue between family members and caregivers, financial advisors and others with the goal of understanding and reaching an agreement about future wants and needs.

One of the main functions of a mediator is providing a "Balance of Power" to the process. In other words, no single individual can "run" or "dominate" the mediation. Your mediator will manage the process in a safe, fair and balanced manner and allow each party to speak about the issues from their own perspective without the other party interrupting or challenging everything that is being said.

The North Idaho Services Directory is now available online and provides the most comprehensive list of service providing organizations in the region, with the ability to sort, filter, and search by category, agency name, zip code, city, and other fields.

It is a vital resource for first responders, who must quickly triage and assist individuals in crisis. Police & fire department personnel and other immediate needs providers can find the information they need in one location.

The database currently has about 600 agencies listed, primarily in Kootenai County and Region 1. However, hundreds more will be added, due to the opening of the Northern Idaho Crisis Center, which opened in December 2015 and serves the 10 northern counties. Website improvements for customized reporting, member login for agencies & funders, outreach & marketing, and database updates & maintenance are also planned.
