Annual “Must Do” List

It's not too late to complete this annual “to do” list to keep your year on the right track and help you avoid costly, frustrating, or time consuming misses.

Check your Credit Score:

Most online sources give you one annual check for no charge. Do your homework first to understand what the score means, what action you need to take if you think there are mistakes, and how to keep track of the report. Review your monthly budget for the year as well.



Check your Insurance Coverages:

It is important to review your policies periodically, especially with skyrocketing construction costs ... The reason behind this is to ensure that you continue to have adequate protection for the future and to safeguard your income earning abilities despite all the life changes you may go through.

Check for Expiration Dates:

- Check your drivers license and make sure it doesn't expire within the year, and that all information is current. Take action early to make corrections and avoid unnecessary fines and fees.
- Check your vehicles license plate tags and insurance cards. Make sure they're current and that you know when they are due to renew.
- Check your credit/debit card(s) for expiration dates to assure any auto pay items associated with them are not interrupted. Also, assure any accounts that have automatic renewals (clubs, memberships, magazines, etc.) are ones you still use, and cancel those you don't want.
- Check payment apps (CashApp, Venmo, etc.) and digital payment cards for expirations, balances, etc.

Send in your Absentee Ballot Request:

Vote from home, easily, and on time. A request for absentee ballots that cover all elections in the current year are available online. See sample here. Mail to the elections office and they will send your ballot in the mail prior to each election. Note: this must be redone every calendar year. Go to kcgov.us > elections > absentee ballot.

Important deadlines for 2024 High School Seniors

NOW is the time to apply for financial aid & scholarships for the 2024/2025 school year. Federal, State, and individual college deadlines vary widely. Most counselors recommend applying for federal financial aid with the FAFSA even if you think you won't qualify, or you think you won't need the aid.

- 2024/2025 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is available NOW (FAFSA.ed.gov – Make sure to use THIS site to apply).
- Early 2024: Deadline for CSS / Financial Aid PROFILE Application (found at CollegeBoard.org)
- March 1, 2024: Idaho Deadline for applying for an Opportunity Grant. (A Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) is a grant for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need.)
- February, March, & April are the main scholarship deadline months. Visit edinfocenter.cda.com/Pay-for-School/North-Idaho-Scholarships for local & regional scholarship opportunities.
- Contact your student's potential colleges to find out about school-specific scholarship opportunities and financial aid deadlines.

Recent Changes (2022) to Know About!

- Simplified form now has 36, rather than 108 questions to answer
- Applications can select their role: parent, preparer, or student
- Drug convictions will no longer affect student eligibility to receive federal aid
- Male applications can receive financial aid even if they don't register for selective service

New “Learning Neighborhood” in North Idaho

A new program serving North Idaho families of pre-kindergarten children is launching in early spring 2024.

Encompassing townships in Latah, Benewah, and Kootenai Counties, the effort is based in Potlatch and funded by a two-year Ready to Learn grant from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting to Idaho Public Television’s family and community education arm.

Partnering with Idaho Public Television’s education team are several local organizations, including The Garden and Lil Moe’s childcare centers, the Harvard Homeschool Co-op, Potlatch Public Library, and the Potlatch Historical Society; Moscow-based organizations IdahoSTARS, Gritman Medical Center, and the Latah County Library system; as well as Parents as Teachers and Idaho Association for the Education of Young Children.

The goal of the North Idaho project is to build a Learning Neighborhood, a network of partners and material supports that enhance the education of young children and their families.

“The work focuses on building family relationships,” says program manager Lenea Pierzchanowski, an education specialist at Idaho Public Television. “And the skills and resources created by the grant will be sustainable long after the program is complete.”

Through a combination of community engagement, family involvement, and professional development, the Learning Neighborhood will create learning priorities of functional literacy, critical and computational thinking, executive functioning, and career readiness.

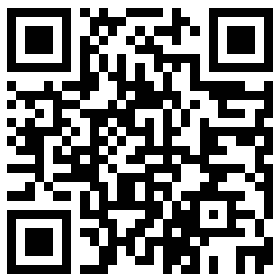
Some of the planned activities are family and community learning workshops, a pint-sized career fair, a Parent University family experience, and mini camps for children and families throughout the spring and summer of 2024.

Molly Clark, director of The Garden daycare and preschool in Potlatch, says “I am thrilled to be part of the Learning Neighborhood project sponsored by Idaho Public Television. This initiative promises to make a significant and lasting impact on the children in our community. I believe it will bring invaluable resources, enhancing the quality of education in our small, rural town.”

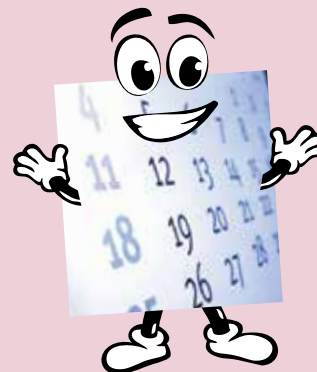

Tesh's new sensory room provides a restful retreat.

New elements to the old building - all to better serve participants.

Tesh's new sensory room is a space where participants can escape sensory overload. The sensory room keeps you enclosed, like a tiny box and it's quiet and private. If a participant's anxiety is kind of heightened, they can opt-in to the space for a few minutes, and then come back to their scheduled classes to continue their learning.

Located in Tesh's Adult Day Health program's new space called The Den, the sensory room provides a room where participants, especially those who identify as neurodivergent, can have greater control over their level of sensory input.

Converted from a storage closet, the dimly lit space has a starry night mountain landscape mural on one wall, numerous fidget toys, lights that can be touched on and off, and textured objects such as smooth and rough rocks, a weighted lap blanket, noise-canceling headphones, and sunglasses.

"It really is about improving well-being, mental health and skill development," said Marcee Hartzell. "Sensory rooms provide a safe haven for individuals to explore various stimuli, helping them manage sensory overload, improve focus, and reduce restlessness. Sensory rooms are not only beneficial for people with autism but can also be useful for those with sensory processing disorders, anxiety, and other conditions."

The sensory room fulfills a repeated request from participants to be able to "take a break" or to "find a space to calm down." The result is a space that participants describe as relaxing, soothing and essential. They also call it "SUPER COOL!"

The sensory room, in the (newly remodeled) Den, is part of new digs throughout the Tesh campus.

"We have made many changes over the last few months here at Tesh. All to better serve our clients. We have upgraded almost every client space in the building: new client chairs and lockers in their lunchroom, a new computer lab with 5 computers, big screen televisions in 3 classrooms, new paint and client inspired artwork on every wall, and now the new ADH room and sensory space," said Hartzell. "We are excited for the next two phases this spring – new clients to fill these fresh new spaces, and our Youth Summer Program beginning in June – in their newly remodeled building!"





Author Spotlight: Mike Baker –

The “EndoDad” Offering Vision and Support Through Art

One year ago, in a situation heartbreakingly familiar to many parents, Mike Baker found himself at a crossroads. As his daughter Samantha endured the relentless pain of endometriosis, Mike, the CEO of Heritage Health, felt the full weight of parental powerlessness. Yet, it was from this deep well of frustration and concern that he drew the resolve to act, desperately channeling his need to “fix-it” energy into a meaningful project that would offer some hope to those facing similar challenges. Mike’s wife Kellie also battles endometriosis as well.

Mike’s journey into the art world might be unconventional, but his drive is anything but. He chose artificial intelligence as his medium, a decision that allows him to infuse his creative energy and ideas with life. His creative process is collaborative, a dance with technology to sculpt images that resonate with the strength and endurance of women who face endometriosis and the many other challenges they face every day.

The images he creates are more than just pixels on a screen; they’re visual affirmations, intended to remind women of the warrior within, especially when the fog of their condition threatens to wipe out their own perception of strength. Through his art, Mike aims to offer visual anchors, symbols of resilience for those moments when the disease feels overwhelming.

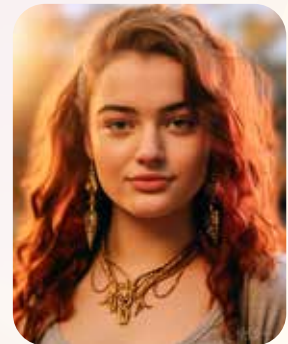
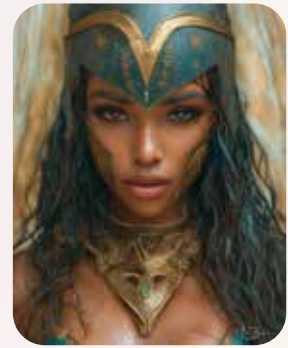
